Approval of the Minutes of the December 4th Meeting

Public Hearing

- 1. Public Hearing concerning the relocation of polling location Ward 4 -
Precinct 2 from the American Legion East Post, 326 Plantation St to the
Seabury Heights, 240 Belmont St, Worcester.**

Niko Vangjeli, Asst City Clerk introduces Jayna Turchek, Director of Disabilities and Human Rights and ADA Coordinator.

Niko Vangjeli shows photos of the current condition of the American Legion East Post and explains that ramp slope is at 15% incline and is not ADA accessible.

Jayna Turcheck speaks about the importance of having ADA accessible polling locations and indicates that American Legion East Post ramp should be at 5% or less slope. Currently indicates that this polling location is in violation of the ADA compliance according to state and federal laws.

Niko Vangjeli shows photos of other locations that were looked at as potential polling locations such as Kiva Center, 209 Shrewsbury St.; US Post Office, 4 East Central St.; East Side Improvement Club, 170 Shrewsbury St.; Volturmo Restaurant, 72 Shrewsbury St.; Dino's Restaurant, 13 Lord St., DPW Customer Service Center, 76 East Worcester St., and explains that these locations cannot be used as polling locations due to accessibility and

parking. Niko also explains that Seabury Heights at 240 Belmont St. is ADA accessible and has spoken with the management to allow voters to park in their facility for Election Day.

Commissioner VanderSpek opened the hearing for public comment concerning the proposed change.

Public Speakers:

- Ben Wrubel, 35 Tampa St., proposed the possibility of raising money to assist with the cost of building a ramp at American Legion East Post. Ben states that the veterans own the building and maybe able to gather the money needed to build the ramp.
- Gary Vecchio, 14 Caprera Rd., states that Seabury Heights is not easily walkable or drivable due to traffic patterns on Belmont St.
- Leonard Ciuffredo, 289 Harrington Way, states that he would recommend to stay at American Legion East Post and research options that would allow voters to remain at current location.
- Sandra Golden, Resident Service Coordinator of Seabury Heights, states they are in favor of having elections be conducted at their location.
- Dianna Biancheria, 8 Ventura Rd, requests Election Commission hold item to have further research done in order to stay at American Legion East Post.
- Frances Lubans, 240 Belmont St., supports the decision to move to Seabury Heights.
- Linda Raymond, 240 Belmont St., supports the decision to move to Seabury Heights, and states it is on the bus line and easily accessible to voters in that area.

Commission Duffy states that he is also concerned about the entrance of American Legion East Post and acknowledges the issue of the ramp.

Commissioner McCallum inquires whether or not there is a possibility to fix American Legion East Post prior to moving to a new polling location and if United Way has been looked into to reconstruct the ramp. Commissioner McCallum asks if there has been any conversations with the owner regarding the issue with the ramp.

Chairman VanderSpek asks if United Way is used as a vendor to construct ramps for city use, also if the city has ever assisted in the construction of building a ramp.

Niko explains that by changing the ramp, it would need to be extended to allow a lesser slope, therefore the ramp would extend into the parking lot. Niko states that the state has a list of vendors that they use for constructing ramps. If actions are not taken to correct current situation with a non ADA compliant polling location, the state can force Commission to make changes. Niko explains a low cost temporary ramp has been constructed by the city to assist with polling locations in the past.

Jayna explains that the ramp would need significant reconstruction in order to make it ADA accessible and because the parking lot is on a slope that would also need a new construction. The

United Way typically only creates ramps for residential use, and residential use have different standards than commercial properties. United Way has a long waiting list which would make it difficult to have a ramp installed in time for Election Day. Property owner would have to reach out to United Way in order for assistance in construction of ramp. Jayna explains if non-compliant with ADA regulations there is a possibility for repercussions.

Commissioner McCallum motions to hold this item.

Motion to hold the proposed change in polling location—Roll Call

Commissioner Duffy – Yes, Commissioner McCallum-Yes, Commissioner VanderSpek-Yes.

2. Public Hearing concerning the relocation of polling location Ward 7 - Precinct 3 from the Coes Pond Village, 39 First St to the Stearns Tavern, 140 Mill Street, Worcester.

Niko displays aerial view of Coes Pond Village parking where parking is being moved further away from voting location-causing issues with handicap voters. Handicap parking spaces that were previously used during elections are now being utilized by the residents.

Jayna explains that Stearns Tavern is ADA compliant and plenty of parking available and able to be utilized during elections as well as it is on the bus line making it easy for voters to access the location.

Public Speakers:

- Marilyn Levitski, 505 Mill St., supports the decision to move to Stearns Tavern because of the parking Coes Pond Village.
- Paul Leary, 57 Delawanda Dr., supports the decision to move to Stearns Tavern or suggests to redistrict Delawanda Dr., Wyola Dr., and Brookline St.
- Patrick Mahoney, 511 Mill St., supports the decision to move to Stearns Tavern.
- Lynn Crystoff, 39 First St., afraid by changing location it will disenfranchise the residents of 39 First St. because of the distance between First St., and Stearns Tavern.
- Margaret Mahoney, 511 Mill St. supports the decision to move to Stearns Tavern because of the parking Coes Pond Village.
- Ralph Berthiaume, 18 First St., concerned with the potential traffic patterns coming out of Stearns Tavern and onto Mill St., and parking at Stearns Tavern.
- Lynn Leslie, 39 First St., disagrees with the move to Stearns Tavern because of the residence of Coes Pond Village inability to get to a new polling location.

Commissioner McCallum recommends to have police detail to assist with the potential of traffic issues that may arise on Election Day.

Niko explains that additional parking spaces will be developed after the March 3rd election that may assist with voters accessing the parking lot of Stearns Tavern, but will have additional information as far as when the parking spaces will be developed at the next meeting.

Commissioner VanderSpek motions for report of a breakdown of voter turnout in Ward 7 Precinct 3 by voters registered at 39 First St. and voters that live at a different address.

Commissioner VanderSpek motions to hold this item.

Motion to hold the proposed change in polling location—Roll Call

Commissioner Duffy – Yes, Commissioner McCallum-Yes, Commissioner VanderSpek-Yes.

3. Public Hearing concerning the relocation of polling location Ward 8 - Precinct 5 from the St. Matthew’s Episcopal Church, 695 Southbridge St to the South Worcester Neighborhood Center, 47 Camp St, Worcester.

Niko explains South Worcester Neighborhood Center was previously a polling location and the reason for changing it out of 47 Camp St. was due to ADA accessibility. He further explains that those issues with the ramp and elevator has been fixed and it is now compliant with ADA specifications.

Jayna confirms that South Worcester Neighborhood Center does comply with ADA specifications.

Public Speakers:

- Resident of Southbridge St., Ward 8 Precinct 5 explains he is a first time voter and looking forward to voting.

Motion to approve the proposed change in polling location—Roll Call

Commissioner Duffy – Yes, Commissioner McCallum-Yes, Commissioner VanderSpek-Yes.

4. Public Hearing concerning Early Voting Locations for the March 3, 2020 Presidential Primary. Early Voting Dates for the Presidential Primary will be from February 24, 2020 through February 28, 2020.

Commissioner McCallum request Blackstone River Valley National Heritage Corridor have better lighting.

Niko provides proposed schedule of early voting. Also, will watch Blackstone River Valley National Heritage Corridor for any lighting issues and will make sure lighting is adequate.

Motion to approve the proposed early voting polling locations—Roll Call

Commissioner Duffy – Yes, Commissioner McCallum-Yes, Commissioner VanderSpek-Yes.

New Business

1. Discussion concerning the implementation of Early Voting (EV) for the March 3, 2020 Presidential Primary.

Niko informs commission that the election office will start informing the public of the early voting schedule and invites commission to assist in the early voting operations. Also explained the hours of operation for Early Voting are suggested through the Secretary of State.

2. Discussion concerning the central tabulation of Early Voting ballots.

Niko informs commission of central tabulation to be conducted at City Hall on Election Day and that central tabulation is the location in which early voting ballots are tabulated. Also, explains the process in which the early voting ballots are kept prior to being tabulated.

Motion to approve City Hall to be the location of Central Tabulation—Roll Call

Commissioner Duffy – Yes, Commissioner McCallum-Yes, Commissioner VanderSpek-Yes.

3. Preparation for the March 3, 2020 Presidential Primary.

4. Discussion concerning the replacement of the AutoMark machine with a new accessible voter assist terminal.

Niko informs commission of other machines other than the AutoMark have been used in other states, however, these machines have not been certified for use on the state level. A letter has been drafted to the State to promote these machines to be certified by the State.

Commissioner McCallum request the writing in the letter be reworded.

Motion to approve the letter be sent to the state with the rewording—Roll Call

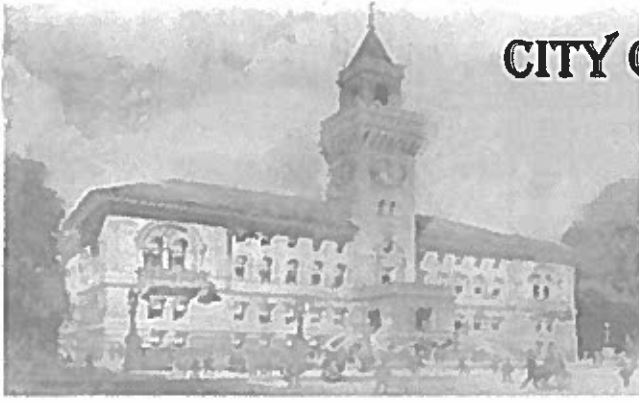
