### Meeting Notice- Public Hearing

Pursuant to Governor Baker's March 12, 2020 Order Suspending Certain Provisions of the Open Meeting Law, G.L. c. 30A, §18, and the Governor's March 15, 2020 Order imposing strict limitations on the number of people that may gather in one place, this meeting of the **Lake Quinsigamond Commission** will be conducted via remote participation to the greatest extent possible. All meetings and hearings listed in the agenda will be done so through remote participation. 2. Roll Call of Commissioners
3. **Public Hearing:** Matters regarding Boat Operator and Owner Alberto Cordero and DAMD Auto Body, of Worcester, pursuant to rule 29 and rule 30.

Rule 29. The Lake Quinsigamond Commission may ban an operator of any vessel from the waters of Lake Quinsigamond for a period of up to one year if the Commission finds after a public hearing that the person operated a vessel in a manner that was negligent or endangered the public.

Rule 30. The Lake Quinsigamond Commission may order the removal of any vessel from the waters of Lake Quinsigamond for a period of up to one year if the Commission finds after a public hearing that the vessel was operated in a manner that was negligent or endangered the public.
