7. Karm 37, Inc., dba Gateway Wine and Spirts, 37 Mechanic Street

Reconsideration hearing

Attorney Arthur Pearlman appeared for the item. He stated that there has come into question whether the churches at this location had been properly notified of the hearing. Mr. Pearlman reviewed each of the churches and where they are located from the proposed premises and presented photos of where each of the existing churches were located and the size of each of location

Mr. Pearlman stated that if you review the law the churches in question are not required to be notified as in Chapter 138 Section 16C it states that a church shall mean a church or synagogue building dedicated to divine worship and in regular use for that purpose, but not a chapel occupying a minor portion of a building primarily devoted to other uses. He stated that this is a complex with other businesses in it and the churches are a very minor portion of the building.

Upon a roll call vote the Commission found 2-0 that property notices to the abutters had been done by the applicant.
